Prayer in this petition is for initiation of contempt proceedings against the respondents for not complying the order dated 19.9.2024 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-23632-2024 titled as “Ex. Constable Balwinder Singh No.495/GRP vs. State of Punjab and others”, vide which the impugned order dated 07.6.2024 (Annexure P-2 therein) was ordered to be set aside with liberty to the Competent Authority to pass fresh order.

At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the order dated 19.9.2024 (Annexure P-1) has been complied with by the respondents vide order dated 28.4.2025.



Learned counsel for the respondent-State also submits that necessary compliance has been made, while passing a speaking order dated 28.4.2025 passed by respondent No.1-Inspector General of Police, GRP, Punjab, Patiala; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

Copy of the aforesaid order dated 28.4.2025 produced by the learned counsel for the respondent-State is taken on record. Registry to tag/paginate the same at appropriate place in the paper-book.

In view of the above, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press the present petition any further.

Dismissed as not pressed.

The petitioner would be at liberty to challenge the aforesaid speaking order dated 28.4.2025 as per law.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
