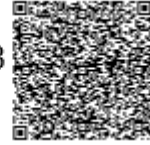

**MAHABIR SINGH SINDHU, J.**

Present petition has been filed under Section 483 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 (*for short 'BNSS'*) for grant of bail pending trial to the petitioner in FIR No.0003 dated 15.02.2025, under Sections 109, 126(2), 324(4), 303(2), 351(2) and 191(3) read with Section 190 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (*for short 'BNS'*); Sections 25 & 27 of the Arms Act, 1959, registered at Police Station Sadar Budhlada, District Mansa.



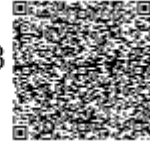
(2) Allegations are that petitioner along with his co-accused, while travelling in a Car, fired gunshot at the *de facto* complainant with an intention to kill him and caused damaged to the Car of complainant.

(3) Contends that it is a dispute regarding working of Truck Union and there is no injury to anyone. Further contends that petitioner is in custody since 25.02.2025; after investigation final report under Section 193 of BNSS was presented on 24.04.2025; but charges are yet to be considered. Also contends that co-accused Raminder Singh has already been granted bail pending trial by this Court vide order dated 20.05.2025, passed in CRM-M-26525-2025. Lastly contends that there is no apprehension that petitioner is likely to pressurize the prosecution witnesses and/or hamper the trial, in any manner.

(4) The above factual position is not disputed by learned State Counsel, on instructions from quarter concerned; but he opposed the prayer on the ground that allegations are very serious in nature.

(5) Heard learned Counsel for the parties and perused the paper-book.

(6) Concededly, petitioner is in custody since 25.02.2025; co-accused-Raminder Singh with similar allegations has already been grated bail pending trial by this Court; final report under Section 193 of BNSS has already been presented on 24.04.2025 and charges are yet to be considered, therefore, conclusion of trial may take sufficient long time. Moreover, it is



not the objection of State that in case petitioner is released on bail, he shall influence the witnesses and/or hamper the course of trial, in any manner; thus, his further incarceration would not serve any purpose.

(7) Consequently, present petition is allowed. Petitioner be admitted to bail pending trial on his furnishing bail bonds and surety bonds to the satisfaction of learned trial Court/Chief Judicial Magistrate/Duty Magistrate concerned.

(8) Petitioner shall fully co-operate with learned trial Court without seeking any unnecessary adjournments.

(9) The above observations be not construed as an expression of opinion on the merits of case.

(10) It is clarified that in case there is any misuse of concession of bail on the part of the petitioner, State would be at liberty to move an appropriate application for recalling of this order.

Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed off.
