Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondent(s) for not complying the order dated 02.12.2024 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-32516-2024 titled as “Baljinder Kaur vs. State of Punjab and others”, vide which the petition was disposed of on the basis of statement made by learned counsel for the State that “...in case, representation dated 24.10.2024 (Annexure P-5) has been received in the office of the respondents and the same is still pending consideration with the authorities concerned, the same will be decided by the competent authority within a period of eight weeks from the date of the receipt of copy of this order by passing an



appropriate speaking order and in case, it is found feasible to accept the claim of the petitioner, the same will be accepted, otherwise due reasons for not accepting the claim of the petitioner will be mentioned in the speaking order so passed, which order will be conveyed to the petitioner for her information and necessary action.”

Learned counsel for the State, on instructions from Shri Vishavdeep, Sr. Assistant, DPI (S.E.) Mohali, submits that the order dated 02.12.2024 (Annexure P-1) shall be complied within two weeks from today.

In view of the above, learned counsel for the petitioner does not press the present petition.

Dismissed as not pressed.

Rule stands discharged.

However, in case the needful is not done, as per undertaking, the petitioner would be at liberty to seek revival of the present contempt petition and in that eventuality, the erring/concerned officer(s) would be liable to pay additional sum of Rs.50,000/- as costs from his/her own pocket in favour of the petitioner towards litigation expenses, immediately, i.e. on the first date of listing of revival application, if any.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
