Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondent(s) for not complying the order dated 20.10.2023 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-7951-2021 titled as “Dharambir vs. State of Haryana and another”, vide which the petition alongwith other connected petitions was disposed of with the following directions :-

“xxx xxx xxx

Let the said consideration be finalized within a period of two months from the date of receipt of copy of this order and in case any petitioner(s) is found eligible for the benefit under the unamended 2018 rules, the said relief be extended to him/her, otherwise detailed speaking order be passed



giving reasons as to why the said candidate is not found eligible for the grant of benefit under the unamended 2018 Rules.

xxx xxx xxx”

The Compliance Report dated 19.9.2024 by way of affidavit of Shri Navdeep Singh Virk, Principal Secretary to Government of Haryana, Sports Department, Chandigarh has already been filed in the Registry, which is annexed with the file. The same is taken on record. Copy thereof is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner(s). Registry to tag/paginate the same at appropriate place in the paper-book.

Learned counsel for the petitioner admits that the order dated 20.10.2023 (Annexure P-1) has been complied with by passing a Speaking Order dated 09.5.2024 (Annexure R-1).

Learned counsel for the respondent-State also submits that necessary compliance has been made, while passing a Speaking Order dated 09.5.2024 (Annexure R-1) by the respondent-authority; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed in the present petition, the same is **disposed of** accordingly.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
