AVNEESH JHINGAN, J (Oral):

The present contempt petition has been filed pleading wilful disobedience of order dated 11.01.2019 passed by this Court in CWP No.6463 of 2017.

The operational part of the order is reproduced below:-

“15. Mr. Ganga submits that there are 13 vacancies available and if that is so, then the case of the petitioners may be considered against those vacancies in the respective categories to which the petitioners belong, that is, SC (Ex-Servicemen) and SC in accordance with Haryana Government instructions on the subject. The interim stay dated May 04, 2018 would continue to operate qua six vacancies irrespective of any other advertisement for filling up the post of Ayurvedic

Dispenser till the case of the petitioners is considered for appointment.

16. The respondents are directed to consider the cases of the petitioners within six weeks from the date of supply of certified copy of this order.”

Learned counsel for the State has produced a recommendation letter for selection of petitioners, same is taken on record. He states that appointment letters will be issued expeditiously. Copy of letter is handed over to learned counsel for the petitioners.

In view of statement made, learned counsel for the petitioners states that no cause of action survives for pursuing the contempt petition.

Disposed of as infructuous.

The rule issued against the respondents is discharged.
