1. The petitioner through instant petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India is seeking direction to respondents to grant compassionate allowance in terms of Rule 2.5 of Punjab Punjab Civil Service Rules (Volume II).

2. The petitioner claims that he has served State of Punjab for 30 years. He was dismissed from service on the ground of absence from duty. He unsuccessfully preferred appeal before Appellate Authorities. He is entitled to compassionate allowance as well as general provident fund. He has filed representation dated 17.03.2025 (Annexure P-4) but to not avail. The grievance of the petitioner, at this stage, would be redressed if respondents are directed to sympathetically consider and decide his representation in a time bound manner.
