1. Compliance report by way of affidavit of Dr. Ravi Kumar Doomra, Director, Ayurveda, Punjab, Sector 11, Chandigarh, on behalf of the respondent has been filed in Court today and the same is taken on record.

Learned counsel for the respondent, on instructions, submits that the claim of the petitioner regarding re-fixation of pay shall be satisfied within a period of two weeks from today.

2. In view of the above, learned counsel for the petitioner does not want to press the present petition.

3. Accordingly, the present petition is dismissed as not pressed. Rule stands discharged.

4. However, in case the needful is not done within the afore-stated period, as per undertaking, the petitioner would be at liberty to seek revival of the present contempt petition and in that eventuality, the erring concerned

officer(s) would be liable to pay additional sum of Rs.50,000/- as costs from his/her own pocket in favour of the petitioner towards litigation expenses, immediately, i.e. on the first date of listing of revival application.
