1. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 528 of B.N.S.S with a prayer to issue appropriate directions to respondents No.1 and 2 to transfer the case from respondent No.3 to any other Judicial Officer at Jalandhar. Several other prayers have also been made in the present petition.

2. During the course of arguments, good sense has prevailed on learned counsel, who is appearing on behalf of the petitioner as well as the petitioner, who is present in the Court. Both of them have stated that the allegations were not made against the Judicial Officer intentionally and both of them tendered unconditional apology in writing. The apology letters submitted by learned counsel for the petitioner and the petitioner have been taken on record as Mark "A" and Mark "B". Both of them have assured the Court that in future, they will be careful in future and will not raise scandalous allegations against the Judicial Officers, without any basis. Both of them have made a

prayer in writing that they wish to withdraw the present petition with liberty to avail his alternative remedies, if any, in accordance with law.

3. I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as the petitioner, who is present in person in the Court.

4. Since, both of them have tendered unconditional apology and have assured not to repeat any such mistake in future, this Court has not inclined to proceed further with the matter.

5. In view of the request made by learned counsel for the petitioner, the petitioner is permitted to withdraw the present petition with liberty to avail his alternative remedies, in accordance with law.

6. Dismissed as withdrawn, with aforesaid liberty.

7. Pending application(s), if any, stand(s), disposed of, accordingly.
