The petitioner incarcerated in the FIR captioned above, has come up before this Court under Section 483 BNSS, 2023 for grant of interim bail for a period of six months on medical grounds in the FIR captioned above .

2. Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is suffering from a serious cardiac ailment and he is admitted in a hospital. He is currently bed ridden and his condition is deteriorating day by day and he is continuously taking treatment from hospital. He further submits that he be allowed interim bail for six months and he undertakes to comply every condition, if this Court imposes.

3. State counsel could not oppose the authenticity of the medical record of the petitioner, however, admitted the fact that he is under treatment.

4. Medical history as well as record produced shows that petitioner is suffering from serious ailment and requires follow-up treatment, as such, he is entitled to be released on bail on medical grounds.

5. Given above, provided the petitioner is not required in any other case, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail **till 03.01.2026 at 11.00 A.M.** in the FIR captioned above subject to furnishing bonds to the satisfaction of the concerned Court and due to unavailability before any nearest Ilaqa Magistrate/duty Magistrate. Before accepting the surety, the concerned Court must be satisfied that if the accused fails to appear, such surety can produce the accused.

6. While furnishing a personal bond, the petitioner shall mention the following personal identification details:

1.	AADHAR number	
2.	Passport number (If available) and when the attesting officer/court considers it appropriate or considers the accused a flight risk.	
3.	Mobile number (If available)	
4.	E-Mail id (If available)	

7. Any observation made hereinabove is neither an expression of opinion on the merits of the case nor shall the trial Court advert to these comments.

8. The petitioner shall surrender in prison from where he was released, on **03.01.2026 at 11.00 A.M.**

9. *There would be no need for a certified copy of this order for furnishing bonds, and any Advocate for the Petitioner can download this order along with case status from the official web page of this Court and attest it to be a true copy. In case the attesting officer wants to verify the authenticity, such an officer can also verify its authenticity and may download and use the downloaded copy for attesting bonds.*

10. **Present petition stands allowed to the extent above.** It is clarified that in case, petitioner's health does not improve then he shall be permitted to file an application for extension of interim bail on medical grounds. All pending miscellaneous applications, if any, stand disposed of.
