1. The instant petition has been filed by the petitioner under Section 528 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023 for quashing of FIR No. 65 dated 20.02.2025, registered under Section 209 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 at Police Station Bhiwani City, District Bhiwani as well as for quashing of order dated 21.11.2024 passed by the Court of learned Judicial Magistrate First Class, Bhiwani in case titled as *Hari Om vs. Dinesh*, arising out of complaint bearing NACT No. 1415-2022, filed under Section 138 of the N. I. Act, 1881, whereby the petitioner had been declared a proclaimed person.

2. At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner has restricted his arguments only to the extent of quashing of impugned order dated 21.11.2024.

3. After advancing arguments at length, learned counsel for the petitioner could not point out any lacuna in the impugned order dated 21.11.2024. However, he has submitted that since the petitioner is ready to



join the Court proceedings, he may be directed to surrender before the learned trial Court.

3. Keeping in view the limited prayer made by the petitioner and the fact that he is ready to join the Court proceedings which would obviously help in speedy conclusion of trial in the aforementioned complaint, the present petition is disposed of. The petitioner is directed to surrender before the learned trial Court within a period of 15 days from today and on doing so, the learned trial Court shall release him on bail, subject to his furnishing personal/surety bonds to its satisfaction.

4. Till the appearance of the petitioner before the learned trial Court, his arrest shall remain stayed.

5. It is made clear that in case the petitioner fails to appear before the learned trial Court within the stipulated time, this petition shall be deemed to be dismissed.

6. However, this relief shall be subject to payment of cost of Rs. 10,000/-, to be deposited by the petitioner with the learned trial Court, which shall be disbursed to respondent No. 2/complainant on his appearance before the Court.
