1. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 483 of B.N.S.S., with a prayer to grant regular bail to him in case FIR No.0200 dated 29.12.2024, registered under Sections 304, 115(2), 351(2), 3(5) of BNS, 2023 (Sections 317(2), 309, 188(1), 238 of BNS, 2023 added later on), Police Station Cantonment, District Police Commissionerate Amritsar.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner was not initially named in the FIR nor any physical description was mentioned by the complainant. The petitioner has been nominated in the present case on the basis of the disclosure statement suffered by his co-accused. He further contends that even during the course of investigation, the police could not



collect any other incriminating evidence to link him with the alleged incident. The petitioner was arrested in the present case on 29.12.2024 and is in custody for the last more than four months. By referring to the order Annexure P-3, learned counsel contends that similarly placed co-accused Simranjit Singh alias Manu has been admitted to bail by this Court.

3. On the other hand, learned State counsel has vehemently opposed the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner on the ground that serious allegations have been levelled against the present petitioner and he does not deserve the concession of bail by this Court.

4. I have heard the learned counsel for the parties and perused the record.

5. The petitioner was arrested in the present case on 29.12.2024 and is in custody since then. Final report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. has already been presented against him. Even the injuries suffered by the injured have already been declared to be simple in nature and the injured stands discharged from the hospital. Moreover, co-accused Simranjit Singh @ Manu has already been admitted to bail by this Court.

6. Without commenting on the merits of the case, the present petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate/Chief Judicial Magistrate, concerned.
