Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondent(s) for not complying the order dated 07.7.2023 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-6577-2020 titled as “Narinder Pal and others vs. Punjab State Power Corporation Limited and others”, vide which the petition was disposed of in terms of order dated 27.4.2023 (Annexure A-1) passed by the same co-ordinate Bench in CWP-24773-2018 titled as “Harish Kumar and another vs. State of Punjab and others” and order dated 26.5.2023 (Annexure A-2) passed in CWP-10637-2020 titled as “Jangsher Singh vs. Punjab State Power Corporation Ltd. and others”. The said order dated 27.4.2023 (Annexure A-1) passed in CWP-24773-2018 depicts as follows :-

“xxx xxx xxx



12. In view of above, the present petition is allowed. Respondent-Corporation is directed to consider the claim of the petitioners and grant them appointment from the date persons junior to them in the same selection process were ordered to be appointed.

13. Needless to say the petitioners will not be entitled for salary for the intervening period on the principle of 'No Work No Pay'. However all other benefits like seniority etc. would be applicable to them from the date persons junior of them in the merit list stand appointed within a period of 8 weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.”

Learned counsel for the respondent has filed the short reply dated 28.8.2025 in the Court, which is taken on record. Copy thereof is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner. Registry to tag/paginate the same at appropriate place in the paper-book.

Learned counsel for the respondents refers to the said reply dated 28.8.2025 and submits that in pursuance to the said reply, the petitioner was appointed on 17.7.2024; thereafter, the petitioner joined on the post on 24.7.2024; and vide office order dated 13.11.2024 (Annexure R-1) all consequential benefits have been released to the petitioner. It is also submitted that the salary of the petitioner has been fixed at par with juniors of the petitioner as directed by this Court.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner shall be entitled for salary for the intervening period



from 07.7.2023 upto date of issuance of order of appointment i.e. 17.7.2024.

Learned counsel for the respondents, on instructions from Mr. Sanjay Kumar Kamra, Deputy Secretary Recruitment, PSPCL informs that vide order dated 07.7.2023 a period of eight weeks was granted to the respondents to comply with the order. Learned counsel for the respondents, on instructions, undertakes that for the remaining period i.e. from 07.7.2023 upto 17.7.2024 after excluding the period of eight weeks, the salary shall be paid to the petitioner within six weeks from today.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in view of the undertaking given by learned counsel for the respondents the present contempt petition be disposed of .

In view of the above, no further orders are required to be passed in the present petition, the same is **disposed of** accordingly.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stands disposed of.
