1. Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 483 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, is for grant of interim bail to the petitioner on medical grounds in FIR No. 114 dated 10.05.2024, registered under Sections 386, 506, 120-B and 384 of IPC and Section 25 of the Arms Act at Police Station Farukhnagar, District Gurugram.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner has been booked in the aforementioned FIR and is facing trial. He is lodged in District Jail, Gurugram. He is not maintaining good health due to some neurological problems. MRI of his brain was conducted. Previously, he had been visiting Civil Hospital, Gurugram and PGIMS, Rohtak but his condition is getting deteriorated. He needs specialized medical care as well as personal care for his well being, which is not possible in custody. Hence, it is urged that the petition deserves to be allowed and the petitioner deserves

to be released on interim bail.

3. Medical Status report of the petitioner has been filed by the respondent-State. The medical condition of the petitioner is not disputed by learned State counsel but he has raised an apprehension that the petitioner may misuse the concession by absconding. The operative part of the medical status report reads as under:

“As per records, he visited Jail Hospital, Gurugram with the complaint of generalised body & chest pain, anxiety, hematemesis etc., he was provided with appropriate treatment at Jail Hospital, Gurugram and he got relieved. He was also referred multiple times to Civil Hospital, Gurugram and PGIMS, Rohtak for the similar complains. The treatment prescribed by the specialists was provided to him at the Jail Hospital. He has also been referred in emergency multiple times, to Civil Hospital, Gurugram since his admission to this jail.

On 20.04.2025, he was brought to Jail Hospital, Gurugram with complaint of chest pain, numbness of bilateral upper limbs and difficulty in breathing. He was referred to Civil Hospital, Gurugram in emergency, for further management of his complaint. There, treatment was prescribed to the patient after few preliminary investigations and referred back to Jail Hospital, Gurugram. The prescribed treatment by the specialist was provided to him at Jail Hospital, Gurugram. On dated 25.04.2025 the patient was referred to GIMS, Rohtak for follow-up and management of his condition, as per OPD schedule. Again on 27.04.2025 he started complaining of chest pain, difficulty in breathing and pain radiating over left upper limb. Hence, he was referred to Civil Hospital, Gurugram, in emergency, from where he was further

referred to Heart Centre at Civil Hospital, by the specialist. A Computerized Tomography-Coronary Angiogram (CT CAG) scan of the patient along with MRI of Brain was also done. He has been regularly referred to Civil Hospital, Gurugram and GIMS, Rohtak.

The said patient has been admitted at Jail Hospital, Gurugram since 13.06.2025, for continuous monitoring and observation as his condition gets worse any time, his blood pressure drops to very dangerous levels, intermittent swelling of face and all four limbs along with numbness which eventually hampers his day-to-day activities. Even with regular efforts and treatment, the said patient is not showing any significant improvement in his health condition. He has also been referred to AIIMS, Delhi multiple times for further management of his health condition.

On dated 17.08.2025, the said patient was referred to Civil Hospital Gurugram, in emergency due to significant drop in his blood pressure and with complaint of headache, legs pain, vomiting, weakness, etc., where treatment was provided to him and advised him to follow-up as per OPD schedule. Looking at his poor health condition letters were written by this office, to the superintendent of prison, Gurugram, vide letter dated 13.05.2025 and another letter No. DJH/GGM/2025/385 dated 19.08.2025, to highlight this medical case and get his treatment prioritized. Since, then the patient has been regularly followed-up at Civil Hospital, Gurugram and on 11.09.2025, the specialist at Civil Hospital, Gurugram further referred him to Nephrology Department at PGIMS, Rohtak. In this regard, he was referred to PGIMS, Rohtak on 16.09.2025 and again on 24.09.2025, for further management of his complaints. Treatment has

been prescribed to the patient which is being provided to him at Jail Hospital, Gurugram, but no significant improvement has been observed in his condition (medical record enclosed). It is pertinent to mention here that; the duration and effectiveness of the treatment entirely depends upon the patient's response to the prescribed medicines and follow-ups. Also, this jail has an ambulance available 24x7 for any patient in need. All patients who are referred to any outside hospital are taken to the respective hospital in accordance with Haryana Prison Rules, 2022. Therefore, in case of an emergency, he can be taken to an outside hospital in an ambulance if his medical condition demands the same.”

4. On a perusal of the above, it is apparent that the petitioner is not maintaining good health and requires proper medical as well as physical attention for his well being. In view thereof, this Court is of the considered opinion that no prejudice shall be caused to either of the parties in case the petitioner is released on interim bail for a limited period. Accordingly, the present petition is allowed. The petitioner is ordered to be released on interim bail for a period of two months, subject to his furnishing personal bonds as well as surety bonds to the extent of two sureties to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate concerned. The period of interim bail shall commence from the date of actual release of the petitioner. The petitioner shall surrender before the jail authorities immediately after expiry of the period of interim bail, without fail.
