**KIRTI SINGH, J.(Oral)**

Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 482 of BNSS is for grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.0023 dated 12.02.2025, under Sections 69, 79 and 318(4) of BNS, 2023, registered at Police Station Samrala, Police District Khanna, District Ludhiana.

2. This Court, while issuing notice of motion, passed the following order on 12.03.2025:-

*“Apprehending arrest the petitioner has filed this petition under Section 482 of BNSS for grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No.0023 dated 12.02.2025, under Sections 69, 79 and 318(4) of BNS, registered at Police Station Samrala, Police District Khanna, District Ludhiana.*

*2. Learned counsel for the petitioner, inter alia, submits that the petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case and he has not committed any offence mentioned in the said FIR. He further submits*



*that prosecutrix is married and has three children whereas the petitioner is unmarried. Previously a compromise dated 08.11.2024 was also effected between both the parties, wherein the prosecutrix stated that she had gone with the petitioner on her own volition, and in which the husband of the prosecutrix was also present and has given his statement. He further submits that the petitioner has not taken any loan on the Aadhar Card of the prosecutrix and nothing has to be recovered from the petitioner - and that the petitioner is ready to join investigation and co-operate.*

*3. Notice of motion.*

*4. Mr. Davinder Bir Singh, Senior DAG, Punjab, waives service of notice on behalf of the respondent-State and seeks time to file reply.*

*5. List on 01.04.2025.*

*6. In the meantime, arrest of the petitioner shall remain stayed and he shall join investigation before the Investigating Agency/Officer and shall also abide by the following conditions as envisaged under Section 482(2) BNSS:-*

*i) That the petitioner shall make himself available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required to do so.*

*ii) That the petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the court or to any police officer.*

*iii) That the petitioner shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court. ”*

3. Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Mukhtiar Singh submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for any further investigation.

4. Having considered the aforesaid facts and circumstances, the petition is allowed. Order dated 12.03.2025 passed by this Court, is hereby made absolute.

5. This order should not be treated as "blanket" order. It will not be read granting the petitioner indefinite protection from arrest. It shall be confined to the FIR mentioned *ibid* and will not operate in respect of any other incident that involves commission of an offence.

6. This order does not in any manner limit or restrict the rights or duties of the police or investigating agency to investigate into the charges against the petitioner.

7. The accused/petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him or her from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer.

8. The accused/petitioner shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.

9. The accused/petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called by the police.

10. It will be open to the police or the investigating agency to move to this Court for a direction under Section 483(3) BNSS (erstwhile Section 439(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973) to arrest the accused, in the event of violation of any term, such as absconding, non-cooperating during investigation, evasion, intimidation or inducement to witnesses with a view to influence outcome of the investigation or trial.

11. Pending application(s), if any, also stands disposed of accordingly.
