1. This 2nd petition has been filed under Section 528 BNSS seeking quashing of FIR No.0097 dated 17.06.2022 registered under Sections 406, 419,420, 465, 467, 468, 471, 120-B IPC and Section 13 of the Punjab Travel Professionals (Regulation) Act, 2014 at Police Station Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur, on the basis of compromise dated 12.09.2022 along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom.

2. The following order was passed on 04.04.2025:

Prayer in this application is for restoration of the main petition, which was dismissed for non-prosecution on 21.03.2025.

Notice of the application to counsel opposite.

Mr. Subhash Godara, Addl. A.G., Punjab, who is present in the Court accepts notice on behalf of the non-applicant/respondent No.1 and raised no objection to the averments made in the application.

Heard.

In view of averments made in the application, the same is allowed, order dated 21.03.2025, is recalled and the main petition is ordered to be restored to its original number and the same is being taken up on board today itself.

Notice of motion for 05.05.2025.

At this stage, on asking of the Court, Mr. Subhash Godara, Addl. A.G., Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.1 – State and Mr. Chirag Sharma, Advocate accepts notice on behalf of respondent No.2 and files Vakalatnama, which is taken on record. Copy of the paper book be supplied to them during the course of day.

Service is complete.

In the meanwhile, the parties are directed to appear before the learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate within two weeks from today or any other date convenient to the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate, to get their statements recorded regarding compromise and after recording their statements, learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate is directed to send report regarding the genuineness of compromise and also to intimate whether any PO proceedings are pending against any of the party on or before the date fixed i.e. 05.05.2025.

A copy of the order be sent to learned trial Court/Illaq Magistrate through fax for compliance.”

3. In compliance of the aforesaid order, a report has been received from the concerned jurisdictional Court that the compromise between the parties is genuine and arrived at without any pressure or coercion from anyone.

4. In view of the compromise and the ratio of law laid down by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in **Narinder Singh and others vs. State of Punjab and another, (2014) 6 SCC 466** and **Shakuntala Sawhney (Mrs) Vs.**

State of Punjab 2007 (3) RCR (CrI.) 1052**, this petition is allowed and FIR No.0097 dated 17.06.2022 registered under Sections 406, 419,420, 465, 467, 468, 471, 120-B IPC and Section 13 of the Punjab Travel Professionals (Regulation) Act, 2014 at Police Station Dasuya, District Hoshiarpur along with all subsequent proceedings arising therefrom are quashed, qua the petitioners.
