**HARPREET SINGH BRAR J. (Oral)**

1. This petition has been filed under 482 of BNSS, 2023, seeking anticipatory bail in case FIR No.192 dated 03.12.2024 under Sections 307, 351(3), 309, 3(5) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023, registered at Police Station City-2, Mansa, District Mansa.

2. On 27.12.2024, the following order was passed:-

“XX XX XX XX

*As per the case of the prosecution, the first informant alongwith certain other co-accused have taken away the first informant's vehicle by intimidation. The first informant alleges to be a sales agent who went to sell the vehicle to Jaspreet Singh. It is alleged that on the pretext of test drive Jaspreet Singh and the petitioner took control over the vehicle and forced the first informant to deboard it by putting knife on his neck.*

*Learned counsel representing the petitioner has produced a photocopy of an affidavit sworn in by the first*



*informant to the effect that the vehicle has already been sold and delivered to Jaspreet Singh.*

*Notice of motion.*

*On asking of the Court, Mr. Manmeet Singh Teji, AAG, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the State.*

*Sh. Ashim Singla, Advocate, enters appearance on behalf of the first informant. List on 03.02.2025.*

*In the meantime, in the event of arrest, the petitioner shall be released on interim bail subject to furnishing personal bonds and surety to the satisfaction of Arresting/Investigating Officer. However, the petitioner shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and shall abide by the conditions as provided under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”*

3. Learned State counsel assisted by learned counsel for the complainant and on instructions from ASI Roos Singh, at the very outset, informs the Court that the petitioner has joined the investigation and his custodial interrogation is not required.

4. In view of the statement of learned State counsel, order dated 27.12.2024 is hereby made absolute. The petitioner shall abide by the terms and conditions envisaged under Section 482(2) of BNSS (*erstwhile Section 438(2) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973*).

5. The petition stands disposed of.
