KULDEEP TIWARI, J.(ORAL)

1. Through the instant writ petition, cast under Article 226/227 of the Constitution of India, a challenge is thrown to the award dated 19.11.2010 (Annexure P-7), passed by the learned Industrial Tribunal concerned, wherethrough, the reference has been answered against the petitioner/workman.

2. The instant writ petition is pending adjudication before this Court, since the year 2012.

3. During the course of the hearing, this Court, vide order dated 28.08.2025, had passed the hereinafter extracted order, upon the instant writ petition :-

“A perusal of the record reflects that instead of complying with the provisions of Section 17-B of the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, the co-workman Sewa Singh, who was also chargesheeted alongwith the present petitioners, was



taken back in service by respondent no.2- management.

The reference preferred by the petitioner-workman way back on 02.05.1985, has been decided against him, vide impugned Award dated 19.11.2010.

At this stage, this Court is of the view that the case of present petitioner can only be considered, for awarding compensation to be payable by the respondent no.2-management.

Adjourned to 18.09.2025.

To be shown in the urgent list.

It is made clear that no further request for an adjournment shall be entertained on the next date of hearing, on behalf of either of the parties.”

4. Today, learned counsel for the petitioner, as well as, learned counsel for the respondent No.2/Management, apprises this Court, that the instant matter can be disposed of, as the respondent No.2/Management, is ready and willing to pay Rs.3,00,000/- as a lump sum amount, to give quietus to the instant dispute, once and for all.

5. In view of the settlement arrived at between the parties concerned, the instant writ petition is **disposed of**, with a *mandamus*, upon the respondent No.2/Management, to pay an amount of Rs.3,00,000/- to the petitioner, within a period of four weeks, from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

6. Ordered accordingly.
