The present contempt petition is filed for non-compliance of the order dated 23.11.2009 vide which a direction was issued to the respondents to work out the disability pension payable to the petitioner and the claim be restricted to three years preceding the filing of the petition.

On the last date of hearing, learned counsel for the respondents had submitted that part compliance of the order has been made and the remaining part shall be complied within six weeks.

Today application has been filed by the respondents stating there that learned counsel for the petitioner has been informed that a sum of Rs.11,48,469/- on account of arrears of pension and regular pension upto January 2018 have been credited to the petitioner's bank account upto 12 February, 2018 and out of which, the pensioner has already withdrawn Rs.9,00,000/- on February 08, 2018. It is further stated that the pension is further being continued to be paid to the petitioner.

In view of the same, the contempt petition is dismissed.

Rule issued against the respondent(s) is discharged.

Since the main petition has been dismissed, the miscellaneous applications are rendered infructuous and the same stand disposed of as such.
