1. The instant petition has been filed seeking extension of parole as already granted to the petitioner by the authorities concerned.
2. The petitioner stands convicted vide judgment dated 13.12.2017 passed by Special Court, Amritsar in a matter arising out of FIR No.159, dated 21.10.2015, Police Station Chattiwind, Amritsar, under Section 21 NDPS Act wherein he has been sentenced to undergo rigorous imprisonment for 15 years and has also been imposed a fine of Rs.2,00,000/-. The appeal, challenging his conviction i.e. CRA-D-155-DB of 2018 is pending in this Court.



3. As per the averments made in the petition, the petitioner has been granted regular parole from 04.08.2025 to 30.09.2025 i.e. upto today. It is the case of petitioner that he has been advised urgent medical treatment for 'Right Renal cell Carcinoma with Myasthenia Gravis with seizues'. The petitioner banks upon medical certificate dated 22.09.2025 (Annexure P-1).
4. Notice of motion.
5. At this stage, Mr. Siddharth Attri, AAG, Punjab, who is present in the Court accepts notice.
6. Having heard the learned counsel for the petitioner and having regard to the grounds set-up for extension of parole, the instant petition is disposed off by extending the parole already granted upto **04.10.2025**. It is made clear that the petitioner would be required to surrender before the jail authorities positively in the morning of 05.10.2025 by 10:00 AM.
7. The petitioner would be at liberty to file an application before the authorities concerned, seeking grant of parole on medical grounds. It shall be open to the petitioner to annex the requisite medical certificate. In case, any such application is moved by the petitioner, needless to mention the authorities concerned shall consider and dispose of the same expeditiously, preferably within a period of 10 days of filing of such application. It is further directed that the Superintendent, Central Jail, Amritsar shall ensure that the medical treatment, as may be required by the petitioner is made available to him while he is in custody. In case he is required to be taken to any speciliazed hospital, necessary arrangements for the same shall be made.
8. The petition stands disposed off accordingly.



9. A copy of this order be conveyed immediately to Superintendent, Central Jail, Amritsar and to other respondents for necessary compliance.
10. Learned State counsel to ensure necessary compliance.
