MAHESH GROVER, J.

The order dated 5.3.2013 required the respondent to consider the grievance of the petitioner as contained in the representation.

Reply filed to the petition indicates that the same has been done, even though according to the learned counsel for the petitioner beyond the time prescribed.

Learned State counsel submits that the time was extended by this Court.

Noticing the facts in entirety, I do not find it to be a fit case to proceed against the respondent under Contempt of Courts Act finding that the order of this Court has been complied with in letter and spirit.

Having regard to the aforesaid, instant petition has been rendered infructuous and the same is disposed of as such. Rule against the respondents is discharged.

Needless to say that the petitioner would be at liberty to pursue his remedy under the law in the eventuality of his having any grievance against the order so passed.
