This Criminal Writ Petition under Article 226 for issuance of writ in the nature of mandamus for issuance of direction to official respondents to protect the life and liberty of the petitioners and to restrain the private respondents not to harass the petitioners.

Learned State Counsel has submitted that a speaking order has already been passed in the representation dated 17.06.2025 (Annexure P-6) by the authorities concerned and has produced the copy of the same, which is taken on record. He has furnished a copy of the order to counsel for the petitioners. The same is reproduced below :-

This is in reference to CRWP No. 6531 of 2025 filed by Neha Gill daughter of Rajesh Gill, resident of House No. 454, Ward

No. 23, Bhagat Nagar, Hoshiarpur, presently stated to be residing with her partner at House No. 408, Sector 18, Vikas Nagar, Mandi Gobindgarh, District Fatehgarh Sahib, and Sanjay Kumar son of Amarnath, resident of House No. 408, Sector 1B, Vikas Nagar, Mandi Gobindgarh.

The petitioners have approached the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, seeking protection of their life and liberty, alleging threat from private respondents No. 4 to 11, and further prayed for directions to restrain the said respondents from interfering in their peaceful married life.

The petitioners were contacted on their given mobile number 79988-80007 by Inquiry Officer ASI Ranjit Singh (No. 513/FGS) for the purpose of recording their statements. However, after initial contact, the said mobile phone was found switched off and further communication could not be established.

Subsequently, a visit was conducted at the given residential address i.e. House No. 408, Sector 1B, Vikas Nagar, Mandi Gobindgarh. It was found that the petitioners were not present at the said address. During the inquiry, the father of petitioner Sanjay Kumar, namely Shri Amarnath, met the police team and recorded his statement that his son Sanjay Kumar, aged about 31 years, had voluntarily married Neha Gill. He further informed that Sanjay Kumar had left home on 16.06.2025, and his whereabouts are not known to the family. His mobile number is also switched off and no alternate contact number is available. Shri Amarnath assured that whenever his son visits the home, he will inform him about the pendency of the writ petition and the need to cooperate with the police inquiry. It is further recorded that as per the records of Police Station Gobindgarh, no application has been received so far from the petitioners for provision of police security. Should any such application be received in the future, prompt inquiry shall be conducted, and necessary legal steps shall be taken without delay.

In this connection, DDR No. 42 dated 19.06.2025 stands registered at Police Station Gobindgarh for official record of proceedings..'
