Main case

Through the instant petition filed under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India, the petitioner has sought mandamus directing the respondents to release the retiral benefits of the petitioner i.e. EPF, pension, gratuity, leave encashment and security etc. along with interest @ 18% per annum from the date of retirement till realization.

2. Learned counsel for the respondent Corporation, at the very outset, submits that the grievance raised by the petitioner in the present petition has been substantially redressed and he refers to order dated 17.9.2025 (Annexure R-1) attached with the additional affidavit filed in compliance of the order passed by this Court on 11.09.2025.

3. Learned counsel for respondents No.2 and 3 refers to para. 4 of the additional affidavit which is reproduced below : -

“4. That the case of the petitioner has been re-examined by the respondents and it has been observed that since no charge sheet was issued nor any disciplinary proceedings were pending against the petitioner at the time of his retirement, therefore, all his retiral dues amounting to ₹ 16,94,385/- on account of 300 days un-availed earned leave encashment, gratuity and security etc. along with interest @ 6% p.a. on delayed payment of retiral dues have been released to the petitioner from the date of his retirement i.e. 30.11.2019 vide order dated 17.09.2025 (Annexure R-1).”

4. In view of the statement made by learned counsel for respondents No.2 and 3, the present petition is disposed of as having been rendered infructuous.

5. Pending application, if any, stands disposed of.
