Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that contempt proceedings be initiated against the respondents for not complying the order dated 22.5.2025 (Annexure P-1) passed by a co-ordinate Bench of this Court in CWP-14950-2025 titled as “Nitan Indoria vs. Punjab State Power Corporation Limited and others”, vide which the petition was disposed of with a direction “....to respondent No.1 to consider and decide the legal notice dated 14.3.2025 (Annexure P-18) served by the petitioner, within a period of 08 weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order by passing a speaking order in accordance with law.”

Learned counsel for the respondent-State submits that necessary compliance has been made, while passing a speaking order



dated 12.09.2025 by the respondent-authority; thus, no cause survives in the present petition.

Copy of the aforesaid order dated 12.09.2025 produced by the learned counsel for the respondent-State is taken on record. Copy thereof is supplied to learned counsel for the petitioner. Registry to tag/paginate the same at appropriate place in the paper-book.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that since the compliance of the order dated 22.5.2025 (Annexure P-1) has been done and the Speaking Order dated 12.09.2025 has been passed by the respondent-authority, the present contempt petition may be disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to challenge the said Speaking Order dated 12.09.2025 in accordance with law.

Heard.

In view of the facts noted above, the present contempt petition is **disposed of** accordingly.

The petitioner would be at liberty to challenge the aforesaid Speaking Order as per law.

Rule stands discharged.

Pending application(s), if any, shall stand(s) disposed of.
