Prayer in the application is for condonation of delay of 26 days in filing the accompanying appeal.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, the same is allowed and delay of 26 days in filing the accompanying appeal is condoned.

Main case:

The present application has been preferred seeking grant of leave to appeal against the judgment of acquittal dated 10.07.2024 passed by the learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Ferozepur, in a case stemming from complaint dated 07.03.2022 filed under Section 138 of Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881.

2. It is noticed that the instant appeal pertains to the year 2024, however, no one has entered appearance on behalf of the applicant(s), hence, it is deemed expedient to nominate a Legal Aid Counsel. Mr. Ankush Kamboj, Advocate, who is present in the Court, is appointed as the Legal Aid Counsel to represent the case on behalf of applicant(s) to arrive at a decision. He has gone through the case file and submits that the present application has been filed against the judgment of acquittal dated 10.07.2024

passed by the Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Ferozepur, in complaint dated 07.03.2022 filed under Section 138 of Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881. She fairly submits that in view of the judgment of the Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in *M/s. Celestium Financial vs. A. Gnanasekaran Etc., 2025(3) RCR (Criminal) 208*, the applicant would have a remedy before the Court of Sessions.

3. The complaint (supra) was filed on the ground of dishonour of cheque of Rs.5,00,000/-. After assessing all the material available on the record, the learned trial Court acquitted the respondent(s) vide judgment dated 10.07.2024.

4. In view of the judgment rendered by the Apex Court in *M/s. Celestium Financial (supra)*, the present application seeking leave to appeal is **remanded** to the learned Sessions Judge, Ferozepur with a direction to treat the same as an appeal filed under Section 372 of the Cr.P.C. (Section 413 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023) and entrust the same to appropriate Court for its disposal on merits.

5. The Registry is directed to send the complete paper-book and the record of the case to the learned Sessions Judge, Ferozepur forthwith.

6. Disposed of accordingly. Pending miscellaneous applications, if any, also stand disposed of.

7. A copy of this order be sent to the High Court Legal Service Committee for information and necessary action.
