**HARPREET SINGH BRAR J. (Oral)**

1. This second petition has been filed under Section 438 of Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No. 160 dated 13.07.2022 registered under Sections 406, 420, 120-B of Indian Penal Code and Section 13 of Punjab Travel Professionals (Regulation) Act 2014 at Police Station Sidhwan Bed, District Ludhiana.

2. On 11.02.2025, following order was passed:

*“Learned counsel for the petitioner has submits that the matter has now been compromised between the parties vide compromise deed dated 24.07.2023, Annexure P-1 and that he is ready and willing to join the investigation as and when required by the investigating agency and will cooperate.*

*Notice of motion for 06.05.2025.*

*At the asking of the Court, Mr. Charanpreet Singh, AAG Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondent-State and prays for time to verify the aforesaid statement.*

*Mr. Davis Jindal, Advocate appears for Mr. Kuldeep Siwach, Advocate, accepts notice on behalf of complainant-respondent No.2, affirms the factum of compromise and has no objection to grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.*

*Meanwhile, the petitioner is directed to join the investigation on or before 21.02.2025. In the event of his arrest, he shall be released on interim bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting*



*Officer, subject to compliance of conditions as enshrined under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.*

*However, it is clarified that if the petitioner does not join and cooperate with the Investigating Agency as required by the Arresting/Investigating Officer, this interim order shall be deemed to have been vacated.”*

3. Learned State counsel on instructions from ASI Sukhmander Singh, submits that in compliance of order dated 11.02.2025 passed by this Court, the petitioner has joined the investigation and is not required for further custodial interrogation.

4. Keeping in view the statement made by learned State Counsel the order dated 11.02.2025, is made absolute. The petitioner shall abide by the terms and conditions enumerated in Section 438(2) of Cr.P.C./Section 482(2) of BNSS, 2023.

5. The petition is accordingly disposed of.
