SUMEET GOEL, J. (ORAL)

1. The substantive prayer made in the petition reads thus:

'It is therefore, most respectfully prayed that the present revision petition may kindly be accepted and Impugned orders dated 02.04.2025 and 10.07.2025 passed by Id, ASJ Jind, to the extent of imposition of condition of depositing of 20% of compensation amount, may kindly be set aside and present revisionist/petitioner may kindly be exempted from depositing 20% of the compensation amount, in the interest of complete and substantial justice.

It is further respectfully prayed that Impugned orders dated 02.04.2025 and 10.07.2025 passed by Id, ASJ Jind, to the extent of imposition of condition of depositing of 20% of compensation amount, may kindly be stayed in the interest of justice.

It is further prayed that the petitioner may kindly be exempted from filing the typed/certified copy of impugned order dated 10.07.2025 passed ASJ, Jind and computer generated copy taken out from e-court Jind website and the same may kindly be taken on record.'

2. Mr. Abhimanu Batra, Advocate has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent and has filed his *vakalatnama*. The same be kept on record.



3. Learned counsel for the rival parties, after obtaining requisite instructions from the respective clients, have submitted that the present petition may be disposed of by directing the concerned trial Court to decide the appeal within a period of 90 days from the date of receipt/production of a copy of the instant order.

3.1 They have jointly further submitted that the order dated 2.4.2025 passed by the learned Additional Sessions Judge, Jind to the extent, that the petitioner (herein) has been directed to deposit 20% amount of the compensation as awarded by the trial Magistrate be kept in abeyance.

4. In view of the consent of the rival parties and upon perusal of the record, the instant petition is disposed of in the above said terms.

5. Pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, stand disposed of accordingly.
