AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J.(ORAL)

In compliance with the order dated 30.05.2012 passed by this Court, the claim of the petitioner has been decided vide order dated 23.05.2014 passed by the Director, Public Instruction (Colleges), Punjab. Even the consequential benefits have also been released to the petitioner.

Counsel for the petitioner states that he is not aware of this fact, however, he has been supplied a copy of the order dated 23.05.2014 along the photocopies of the cheques by which consequential benefits have been released to the petitioner.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition has been rendered infructuous and is disposed of as such.

In case, the petitioner has any other due which has not been paid to her, she can make a representation to the Director, Public Instruction (Colleges), Punjab within a period of two months from today. If such a

representation is made, the same shall be considered and decided by the Director, Public Instruction (Colleges), Punjab, within a period of two months from the date of receipt of such representation. In case, the claim of petitioner or part thereof is accepted, the consequential benefits be released to her within a further period of two months. It would also be open to the petitioner to claim interest on delayed payments as per law.

Rule stands discharged.
