SUDEEPTI SHARMA J. (ORAL)

1. The present contempt petition has been filed for deliberate and intentional disobedience of order dated 24.07.2023 passed by this Court in CWP-15622-2023.

2. This Court had issued the following directions in CWP-15622-2023, vide its order dated 24.07.2023:-

“4. Hence, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to respondents No.4 and 5 to pass an appropriate speaking order on the representation dated 06.06.2023 (Annexure P-5) within a period of eight weeks from the receipt of copy of this order and thereafter, in case any benefit accrues to the petitioner, the same be released within a further period of two weeks.”



3. In compliance of the order dated 24.07.2023 passed by this Court in CWP-15622-2023, compliance affidavit dated 22.09.2025 of Sh. Lakhbir Singh, Secretary of the Jagatpur Multipurpose Cooperative Agriculture Service Society Ltd., Jagatpur, Tehsil and District Saheed Bhagat Singh Nagar, Punjab, has been filed before the Registry. The same is taken on record. The relevant portion of the said compliance affidavit is reproduced as under:-

“5. That in compliance of the order, the then Administrator passed the speaking passed a Speaking Order dated 20.09.2023, vide which it was ordered to release 50% of the amount deposited by the petitioner with the Society on submission of the copies of the FDR. It was ordered by the Administrator that depending on fiscal situation of society rest of the amount of the FDRs of the petitioner will be taken later in next fiscal year. Accordingly, 50% amount including Principal and interest on the three FDs) i.e. Rs. 8,58,000/- was released to the petitioner on 15.04.2024.

6. That now during the pendency of the contempt case, this Hon'ble Court directed the society to pay 25% of the balacne of the amount to the petitioner. So, accordingly, the society paid an amount of Rs. 2,12,500/- to the petitioner on 30.07.2025 and the same was receive by the Special Power of Attorney Holder of the petitioner.

7. That now on 09.09.2025, the society has released whole of the balance of the amount of Rs. 6,46,850/- vide cheque no. 023673 drawn on the Nawanshahar Central Cooperative Bank Ltd., Nawanshahr and the same has again been received by the Special Power of Attorney Holder of the petitioner. Therefore, as per the account statement an amount of Rs. 17,17,350/- has been paid to the petitioner as this amount includes the interest on the amount of three (3) F.Ds amounting to Rs. 16,05,000/-.

8. That as per the above the society has released whole of the amount of FDs to the petitioner and to his power of attorney. Therefore, as per the record of the

society, nothing more is payable to the petitioner and the order dated 24.07.2023 stands complied with.”

4. Learned counsel for respondents No.2 and 3 submits that the order dated 24.07.2023 passed by this Court in CWP-15622-2023 has been complied with, which is not disputed by learned counsel for the petitioner.

5. In view of the above, since order dated 24.07.2023 passed by this Court in CWP-15622-2023, has already been complied with, therefore, the present contempt is purged and rule stands discharged.

6. Pending application(s), if any, also stand disposed of.
