1. The petitioners have filed the present writ petition under Articles 226/227 of the Constitution of India with a prayer to issue a writ in the nature of Mandamus directing the respondents to grant the statutory pay scale to them as per 2009 Rules (Annexure P-7) i.e. Rs.5910-20200 Grade Pay of Rs.2000/- later on Grade Pay increased to 10300-34800+Grade Pay of Rs.3200/- vide letter dated 23.12.2011 (Annexure P-8) along with arrears at interest rate of 12% thereon. A further prayer has been made to direct the respondents to take into account the statutory pay scale of Rs.5910-20200 Grade Pay of Rs.2000/- later on increased to 10300-34800+Grade Pay of Rs.3200/- vide letter dated 23.12.2011 (Annexure P-8) with future pay revisions. A further prayer has been made for directing the respondents to grant of allowances/full pay along with all other emoluments etc. to the petitioners during probation period from the date of their appointment.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioners contends that the case of the petitioners is squarely covered by the ratio of the law laid down by this Court in **CWP-15896-2023 (O&M)**, titled as **“Saurabh Sharma and others Vs. State of Punjab and Anr.”** dated 13.09.2024.

3. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioners have already submitted a representation dated 05.07.2025 (Annexure P-14) to the respondents and he shall be satisfied in case, appropriate directions are issued to the respondent No.1 to decide the representation dated 05.07.2025 (Annexure P-14) in a time bound manner.

4. Notice of motion.

5. On the asking of the Court, Mr. Amarpreet Singh Bains, AAG, Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents and has no serious objection to the prayer made by learned counsel for the petitioners, at this stage.

6. I have heard learned counsel for the parties and perused the record carefully.

7. At this stage, it would be appropriate to direct respondent No.1 to decide the representation dated 05.07.2025 (Annexure P-14) in view of the law laid down by this Court in CWP-15896-2023, titled as **“Saurabh Sharma and others Vs. State of Punjab and Anr.”** dated 13.09.2024 within a period of four months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.

8. Needless to observe that respondent No.1 shall pass a speaking and well reasoned order in the light of the above referred judgment as well as relevant rules/instructions and in case, it is found that the petitioners are entitled to any consequential relief, the same may also be released to the petitioners within a period of two months, thereafter, along with interest.

9. The present petition is disposed of, accordingly.
