1. The petitioner has filed the present petition under Section 483 of B.N.S.S with a prayer to grant regular bail to him in case FIR No. 255, dated 28.05.2020, registered under Sections 409,420,467,468,471 and 120-B of IPC and Sections 7,13(1)(d) of Prevention of Corruption Act, Police Station Central Faridabad, Haryana (Annexure P-1).

2. Vide order dated 04.12.2024 passed by this Court, the petitioner was ordered to be released on interim bail. Thereafter, he is regularly appearing before the Court and has not misused the concession of interim bail in any manner.

3. Moreover, a status report by way of an affidavit of Commissioner of Police, Faridabad has been filed with regard to the investigation of 293 cases, wherein, the investigation was pending for the last more than 03 years. The following averments have been made in the status report:-

“All the Deputy Commissioners of Police, Faridabad, have again submitted their reports and according to the same, out of 293 cases, in 152 cases and 27 cases proceedings have been stayed by Hon'ble Supreme Court of India & Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court respectively, in 82 cases challans/supplementary challans have been submitted before the Ld. Trial Courts, in 03 cases cancellation report have been scribed, in 04 cases closure reports have been submitted and in 16 cases untraced reports have been scribed/filed. Now, only 09 cases are under investigation and out of which investigation of 01 case has been transferred to SCB, Faridabad, besides the above cases and the same will be concluded at the earliest”.

4. In view of the above referred averments, it is apparent that the investigation is pending only in nine cases for the last more than 03 years and it is expected that the police shall conduct investigation fairly and the investigation shall be concluded at the earliest.

5. Since, the petitioner has already been ordered to be released on interim bail and he has not misused the concession of bail in any manner, the present petition is allowed and the interim order dated 04.12.2024 is made absolute. It is made clear that the petitioner shall continue to appear before the Trial Court on each and every date of hearing and shall not absent himself from the Trial Court proceedings, without prior permission of the Trial court.
