1. The present petition has been filed for quashing the order dated 07.01.2021 (Annexure P-13) passed by the learned Judicial Magistrate First Class, Mohali, whereby the petitioner was declared a proclaimed person in FIR No. 29 dated 07.12.2018 (Annexure P-1), registered at Police Station NRI, District SAS Nagar, Mohali, under Sections 498-A and 406 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Section 406 added later), along with all consequential proceedings arising therefrom.

2. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that, pursuant to the order dated 29.07.2024, the operation of the impugned order dated 07.01.2021 (Annexure P-13) was stayed. In the meantime, the petitioner joined the proceedings, has been granted the concession of anticipatory bail vide order dated 04.10.2024 passed by Additional Sessions Judge, SAS

Nagar, Mohali. However, counsel for respondent No. 2 contends that the petitioner has violated the terms and conditions of the anticipatory bail against which the complainant has already moved an appropriate application for cancellation of bail, which is currently pending before the trial Court.

3. Without prejudice to the complainant's right to pursue her remedy for cancellation of bail, the order dated 07.01.2021 (Annexure P-13) is hereby set aside, subject to the condition that the petitioner shall regularly and diligently appear before the trial Court and shall not absent himself from the proceedings.

4. Accordingly, the present petition stands allowed in above terms.
