Prayer in the present petition is for directing the respondents to issue joining letter/letter of appointment to the petitioners on the post of "Taxation Inspector" as the petitioners have been recommended and were placed in waiting list of EBPG Category at Sr. No.1, 3 and 4; since 7 posts out of 17 posts of "Taxation Inspector" of EBPG category are still lying vacant.

After arguing at some length, learned counsel for the petitioners submits that with regard to their grievance(s), the petitioners have submitted a representation dated 22.12.2024 (Annexure P-10) but the respondents have neither responded to the same nor have they taken any action thereupon so far.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Tapan Kumar, DAG, Haryana accepts notice on behalf of the respondents and prays for some time to complete instructions and file response, if necessary.

Learned counsel for the petitioners, however, contends that he would be satisfied at this stage, in case respondent No.2- The Principal Secretary to Government of Haryana, Department of Excise & Taxation, Haryana, Haryana Civil Secretariat, Chandigarh is directed to consider and decide the representation dated 22.12.2024 (Annexure P-10) submitted by the petitioners, by passing a speaking order in a time bound manner.

Learned State Counsel does not have any objection to the request made by learned counsel for the petitioner.

Accordingly, in view of the above; with the consent of the parties and without commenting anything on the merits of the case, the present petition is disposed of while directing respondent No.2 to consider and decide the representation dated 22.12.2024 (Annexure P-10) by passing a reasoned and speaking order after affording an opportunity of hearing to the respective parties within a period of three months of the receipt of certified copy of this order.

Needless to mention that upon considering the said representation, if the claim of the petitioners is found genuine and admissible as per law, the needful shall be done within a further period of one month.

Petition stands disposed of accordingly.
