NIDHI GUPTA, J. (ORAL)

1. The present petition has been filed alleging violation of order dated 23.07.2024 (Annexure P-1) passed by a Division Bench of this Court in CWP-4868-2018 titled as 'Madan Lal vs. State of Punjab and others', whereby it was directed as follows:-

“That being so, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that let this petition be disposed of, for the present, to enable the parties to contest the revision. However, in the given circumstances, he submits that the Revisional Authority be directed to decide the matter within a specified time. Further, after the matter is decided by the Revisional Authority, the party aggrieved by the order so passed, shall be at liberty to avail such other remedies, as admissible in law.

In response, learned State counsel submits that the matter shall be decided within a period of three months from today.”

2. At the very outset, on instructions from Sh. Navneet Singla, Assistant Town Planner, learned counsel for the respondent has informed that the Revisional Authority was constituted only on 18.08.2025;



whereafter personal hearing was granted to the petitioner on 08.09.2025. Further, learned counsel for the respondent undertakes that the speaking order shall be passed within a period of 08 weeks from today.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that in view of the aforesaid undertaking of learned counsel for the respondent, the present petition may be disposed of with liberty to the petitioner to revive the same in case any cause of action survives or in case, the undertaking given by learned counsel for the respondent is not fulfilled.

4. Heard.

5. In view of the facts noted above, no further direction is required to be passed; and the present petition is hereby **disposed of**, with the aforesaid liberty to the petitioner.

6. Rule stands discharged.

7. Pending application(s), if any, shall also stand disposed of.
